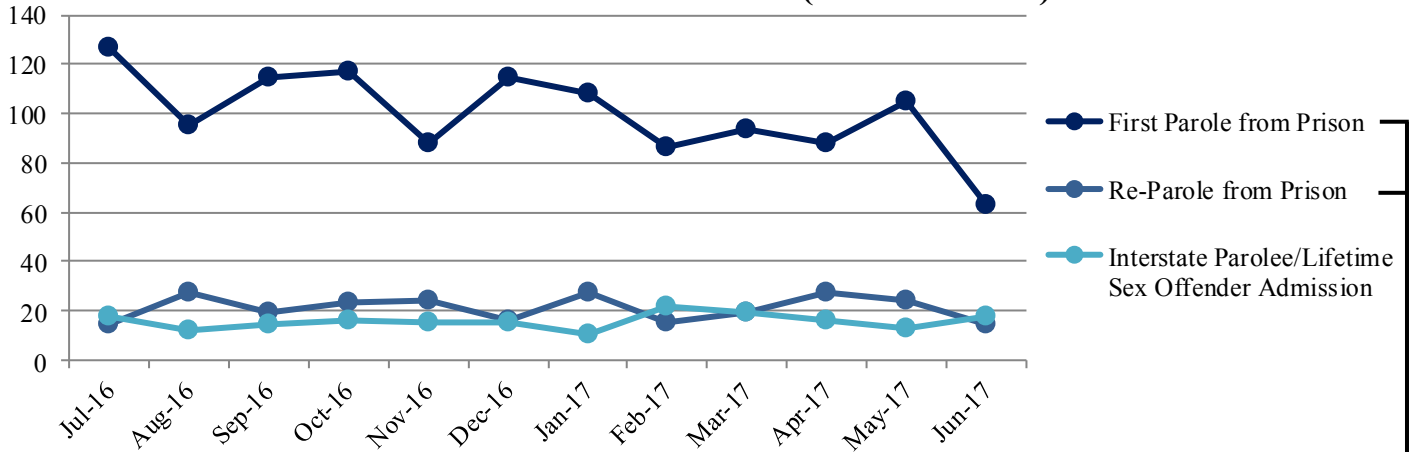


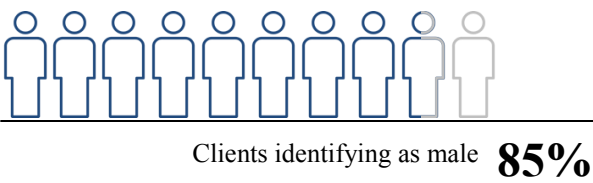
PAROLE ADMISSIONS AND CLIENTS IN FY 2017

In fiscal year 2017 (July 1, 2016-June 30, 2017), the Division of Parole Supervision provided supervision for 2,426 inmates from the state of Nebraska and 287 inmates from others states across the country. Inmates may be placed on parole once they are eligible for parole; eligibility for parole is generally established after an inmate has served half of their sentence. Along with regular inmates, parole also provides supervision for sex offenders who are sentenced to lifetime community supervision. The following figures provide data regarding parole admission numbers and client demographics for clients who were on community supervision for FY 2017.

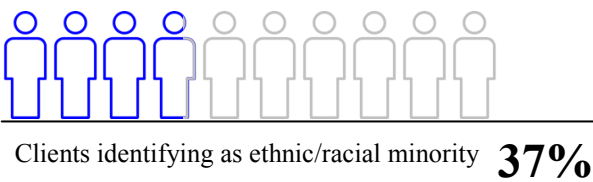
Parole Admissions FY 2017 (7/1/16-6/30/17)
